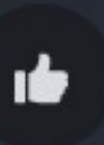

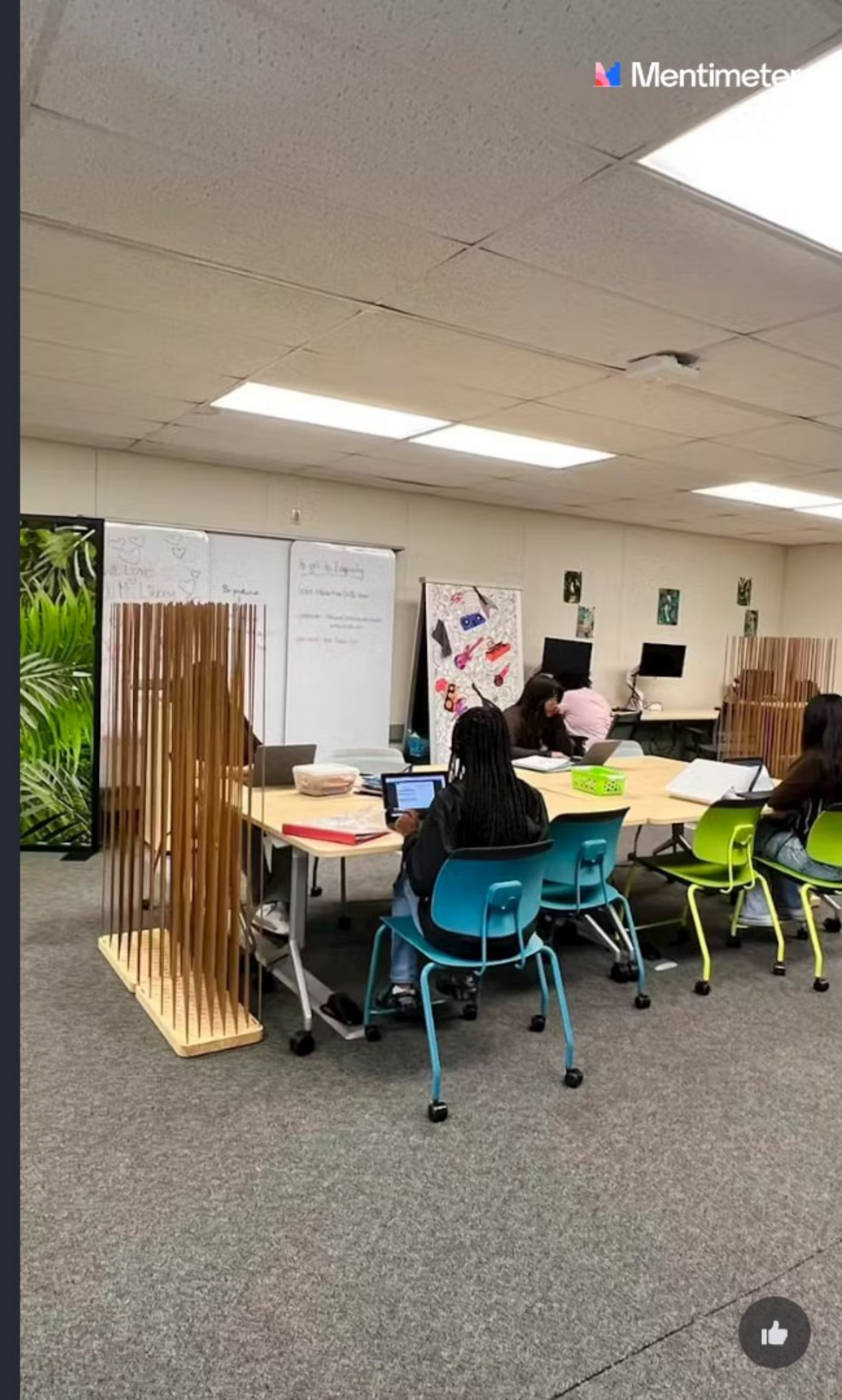

# Consumer Services

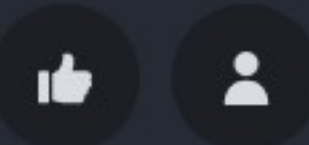
- Employment and Management skills needed in careers that involve helping consumers.

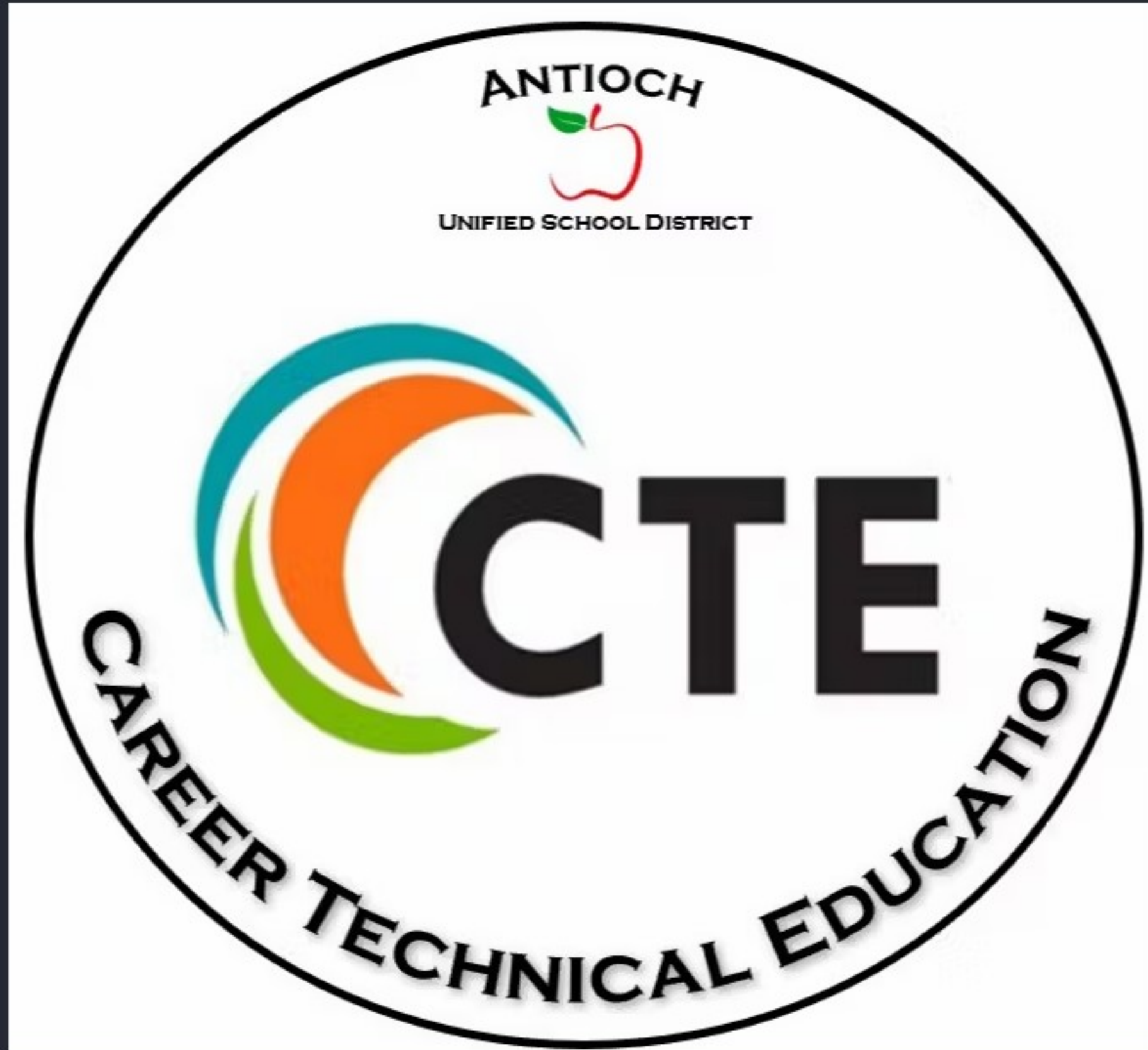
## State of the Art Classrooms

# Next Steps - Internships

Paid Internships Student rate

Minimum of 35 hours of work

Supervised Hands-On Activities

Interview Skills

Employee Feedback and Coaching

Students enroll in Consumer Services pathway at Alternative Education site

Students' complete application for student worker – submit to classroom teacher

WBL/CTE team will work to identify an applicable department for student worker from the list of volunteers from each department

Student completes work permit and submits work permit to the school site for processing

Once a work permit is issued, the student packet may be sent to HR

Application is sent to Classified HR for employment processing

The student is notified of placement and schedule

Tracking of students' placement, start/end date, supervisor evaluation – (NAME)

Students are tagged in Aeries with supervisor evaluation as having completed an internship
