




## Changes in the Job Market

Since 2008, 94% of all net new job creation has NOT been full time employees



43% of recent college graduates hold jobs that don't require a college degree additionally 66% of them remain underemployed after 5 years



Independent workers, freelancers are growing 3x as fast as the rest of the labor force



By 2027, it is expected that freelancers will outnumber employees who have a single "job" or professional affiliation



"I work as a freelancer on a production team for an event and design agency. I handle vendor management, decor and furniture sourcing. I love it!" Graduates' (2016-2020) response to: "What are you doing now for work & income?"

"I'm majoring in animal science and in my last quarter. Currently, I am working at a donkey and mule sanctuary. I'm going to be a veterinarian."

"I do have a company that started as a side hustle...ended up becoming a full time job. I was property managing before covid and now we rent space to clients for off site meetings and staff development. I'm now working in corporate hospitality and found my passion!"

"I'm currently working for the Golden State Warriors as a special events assistant. Originally, I wanted to be a nurse but I've found my passion working in events and it's so rewarding it doesn't even feel like work." "I'm finishing my marketing degree and working at a tech company in San Mateo. As a side hustle, I also coach 4th-11th grade basketball." "Unfortunately, no cool side hustles for me. I'm a software engineer at Disney so it's a very traditional 9-5 Monday through Friday role."

"I currency work at Rakuten full time, however I am very passionate about the beauty industry and clean products so I recently also started working for a startup called Minori Beauty helping with marketing and sales!" "I work for AT&T but came across a post asking for help with advertising and marketing. I responded, learned how to monetize it and now have a side hustle of social media marketing for instagram pages."

"I majored in Spanish and am working for the SF Giants and will be transitioning into a property management role for Stanford."

"I'm not really working right now. I'm still undecided. I worked as an EMT and as an automotive technician at Tesla but found it wasn't for me." "My end goal is to be a teacher, but along the way I'm catering select parties." "I started my own restaurant in Miami ... I also have been doing interior design with high-end handmade rugs and carpets, an interest I picked up a few years ago. I attend antique and trade shows and network. I want to state I did not come from a wealthy family or attend college. Everything I have is from my own sweat and tears...I didn't go to football games or house parties but I can look back and I'm glad I did what I did."

"I studied marketing and design, worked as a baker, line cook and have vended festivals around the world. Now I'm a marketing coordinator at Reebok." "I've been working as a hairstylist for a while. I also got my business degree to accompany my cosmetology license. I'm really enjoying it."




What percent of students seem to be on a "traditional career path?"
